Membership Renewal

Keep in mind that in order to be covered by our insurance policy, you must be a member of record.

- 1. **Dues:** Dues are \$15 per year per person and \$25 per year for a family. If you wish to receive a paper copy of the newsletter there is an additional \$10 fee. The Email version of the newsletter is included in the membership.
- 2. **Minors:** All members under the age of 18 need the signature of a guardian to join. Those under 16 will not be allowed to carry a firearm. Those under 14 may not participate in reenactment battles. In addition the WVRA complies with the particular rules at specific events regarding age.
- **3. Meetings:** Will usually be held at the first Saturday of the month during the off-season. During the Reenacting season, meetings may be held at particular events as needed.
- **4. Families:** All individuals should have their own memberships, although family memberships, covering the entire family can be used to save cost. This is limited to members and their home-based children.

ANOTHER PERSONAL STORY - While reading Allan Eckert's That Dark and Bloody River - Chronicles of the Ohio River Valley and in particular his pages on the 1782 Battle of Upper Sandusky, I came across a reference to a John Orr. At this battle, William Crawford's 500-man Pennsylvania militia army was surrounded by a larger army of Native Americans and

British Rangers. There was a reference in Eckert's narrative of the battle, to a John Orr. My four-great grandfather John Orr was living in Southwestern Pennsylvania in 1782 when Crawford's army was recruited. After reading footnotes, I realized that there were other similarities. After researching on Ancestry.com, I found my relative's pension application which describes how he was shot through the hip at the Battle of Upper Sandusky. It is always a thrill to me to find these family connections to historical events. Grandfather Orr suffered through this defeat and the horrible retreat from the present day Upper Sandusky area back to the Ohio River.

THE CLARKSBURG HISTORY MUSEUM is apparently planning an exhibit on Stonewall Jackson in the near future. Details as they become available. The Museum is located on Main Street in Clarksburg across from the street from the Episcopal church where we have danced and met in the past. Check their website for their irregular hours.
