RESPECT & DISRESPECT AT DROOP

RESPECT

I thought the Memorial Service at Droop Mtn. reenactment on Sunday was a very well done and emotionally moving experience. I contacted Helena Gondray, who lives next to Droop Mtn. State Park, after Tonya Daft facebooked me to contact this lady as she wanted to do Memorial Service. I concurred with her plans and placed the Memorial Service on the schedule. Helena read a poem by Louise McNeill Pease titled "*Droop Mountain*" and had family members, neighbors and friends (a lady representing Sons of Union Veterans Auxiliary) read the names of those killed at the Battle of Droop Mountain. WVRA members Tim Glaser said prayer and Chris Johnson read poem "Bivouac of the Dead".

It was a very respectful and moving experience, I had a catch in my throat and a tear in my eye at the conclusion of the service.

DISRESPECT

On Saturday morning at Droop, I had the Union Infantry march down to the two union monuments to Sgt. John D. Baxter and Lt. Henry Bender of Co. F, 10th West Virginia Infantry at 10AM to await their orders for tactical. I told the stories about Sgt. Baxter and Lt. Bender and placed a US flag beside monument to Sgt. Baxter to honor him for his bravery and giving his life to preserve the Union and help make West Virginia a new state.

The disrespect part of this was that I had to ask Chapman's Battery (Confederate) to please remove their cooking utensils from the Monument. I had to move some of their gear that was strewn around the Monument to place the US flag. *I would never disrespect a Confederate Monument in such a way.*

Maybe I'm being too sensitive but Sgt. Baxter was a Union hero and was mortally wounded on that spot and died the next day of his wounds.

If we continue to host the Droop reenactment, I will ask that no one be allowed to camp near the Monuments to prevent hem for being disrespected.

**The muffled drum's sad roll has beat
The soldier's last tattoo;

That brave and fallen few.
On fame's eternal camping ground
Their silent tents to spread,
And glory guards, with solemn round
The bivouac of the dead.
No rumor of the foe's advance
Now swells upon the wind;
Nor troubled thought at midnight haunts
Of loved ones left behind;
No vision of the morrow's strife
The warrior's dreams alarms;
No braying horn or screaming fife
At dawn shall call to arms.
Their shriveled swords are red with rust,
Their plumed heads are bowed,
Their haughty banner, trailed in dust,
Is now their martial shroud.
And plenteous funeral tears have washed
The red stains from each brow,
And the proud forms, by battle gashed

NOTES and DETAILS:

- DUES:** Dues are \$15 per year per person. Family dues are \$25 per year. There is an additional cost of \$15 per year if you must have a paper copy of the newsletter mailed to you. (Email version of same newsletter is included in membership.) For group insurance purposes, all dues must be paid by or before March 1st. The reenacting year is from March 1st to February 28th of the following year, and membership files must be updated each year.
- MINORS:** Any member under the age of 18 needs the signature of an adult parent or guardian to join. Those under 16 will not be allowed to carry firearms, and members under 14 may not participate in reenactment battles. In addition, rules at specific reenacting events may restrict or deny participation by reason of age, and the WVRA will comply with event rules.
- MEETINGS:** Regular meetings are held, usually on the first Saturday of each month. During the reenacting year, meetings may be held at the various reenactments. Ask for meetings times and places when you join or check for info on the website (www.wvra.org).
- FAMILIES:** Each "soldier" should have their own membership, dues, and form on file. Individual Civilian Reenactors should also have their own complete membership. To encourage family participation, the special Family Membership dues rate (above) can be used to save cost. All family members are welcome to participate informally at WVRA events without paying individual dues. Persons who do not pay dues will naturally have no voice or vote in Association matters, however.
- DIRECTORY:** Member images and photos may be used for the newsletter, website, and WVRA public relations releases. However, detailed information like addresses and phone numbers will ONLY be listed in the directory circulated to other members. Such information will never be used in press releases or put on the website. If you still have privacy concerns and don't want your information used in any form at all, you must send a simple written request to that effect to the newsletter editor, secretary, and webmaster before April 1st of each year.
